

LAKE VICTORIA WATER & SANITATION INITIATIVE

Accomplishments in Tanzania

BACKGROUND

The Lake Victoria Water and Sanitation Initiative was launched on 16th August 2004 during the Stockholm Water Week as a Regional Initiative to be implemented in Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda. In Tanzania the Initiative has been implemented in Bukoba, Muleba, Mutukula and Bunda.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE

- Promote pro-poor water and sanitation investments in the secondary urban centres in the Lake Victoria Region
- Support development of institutional and human resource capacities at local and regional levels for the sustainable delivery of improved water and sanitation services
- Facilitate realization of upstream water sector reforms at the local level in the participating urban centres
- Reduce the environmental impact of urbanization in the Lake Victoria Basin



IMPLEMENTATIONS IN TANZANIA

SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT

Mutukula: Procurement of small tractor and bins for the management of solid wastes,

Muleba: Procurement of one large and one small tractor with skip and bins for the management of solid wastes

Bukoba: Procurement of four large and two small tractors with skips and bins for the management of solid wastes.

CAPACITY BUILDING

Muleba and Bukoba: Focused Urban Water Supply Authority staff and the change agents, with On-job training sessions focusing on the development and implementati of utility-based Performance Improvements Programmes, Tailor-made training for community members targeting water supply, sanitation, solid waste management, environment, gender, the inclusion of vulnerable [the most disadvantageous] groups, local economic development and good governance.

Mutukula: Targeted all Water and Sanitation stakeholders and the community as a whole.

Bunda: Bunda Urban Water Supply Authority to enable it improve its water services delivery.

STRATEGIC URBAN PLANNING

Muleba Participatory strategic urban planning was carried out in Kagabiro The new Kagabiro development plan was developed and approved by the Ministry of Lands and Human Settlements

Bukoba: The new Bukoba Strategic Urban Plan was developed and approved by the Ministry of Lands and Human Settlements.
