I. INTRODUCTION TO THEME

The MDG Summit provides an excellent opportunity to enhance the ongoing tripartite partnership between the European Commission (EC), the ACP Group of States and UN-HABITAT in order to raise challenges and address common concerns on urban poverty reduction and to promote sustainable urbanization in developing countries, especially in the ACP regions.

ABOUT THE PROGRAMME

PSUP is currently being implemented in the Africa, Caribbean and Pacific States. These regions, while being among the most poor in the world, face the highest urbanization rates. Consequently, PSUP targets the most vulnerable population in these regions with an aim to improving their living conditions and their access to the basic urban services.

Supported by the ACP Secretariat, the PSUP is funded by the European Commission through the 9th European Development Funds (EDF) and other donors. It is currently being implemented by UN-HABITAT in 66 cities and 30 countries and is making progress in addressing urban poverty in a participatory and holistic manner.

II. BACKGROUND

The MDG Summit provides an important platform to raise the profile of urban development needs and to share the PSUP's significant outcomes with development partners who will be attending the Summit.

The PSUP global efforts joins governments and other development cooperation partners around the world which have advanced the achievements of the Millennium slum target which improved the lives of 227 million people between 2000 and 2010. However, despite this remarkable target achievement - arguably set to low at the outset - the proportion of slum dwellers in the world, currently estimated at 828 million, continues to grow by around 27 million every year, intensifying urban poverty worldwide.

PSUP IN BRIEF

90 ACP cities are taking part in PSUP's urban profiling whose purpose is to strengthen capacity of local, central and regional institutions and key stakeholders' in settlement and slum improvement. This will be done through the use of good governance and management approaches, pilot projects and contributing, where needed, to the policy development and implementation of institutional, legislative, financial, and normative and implementation frameworks. Overall, the programme aims to achieve poverty reduction, city-wide slum upgrading and improve the management of urbanization in African, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) countries.

PSUP seeks to contribute to the MDGs particularly:

MDG 7 Target 10: "reduce by half the proportion of people without sustainable access to safe drinking water by 2015",

MDG 7 Target 11: "achieving significant improvement in the lives of at least 100 million slum dwellers until 2020",

MDG 1: "Eradicate Extreme Poverty",

MDG 3: "Promote Gender Equality and Empower Women",

MDG 6: "Combat HIV/AIDS, Malaria and other diseases",

and MDG 8: "Develop a Global Partnership for Development".

Most importantly, the EC, the ACP Group of States and UN-HABITAT will have the opportunity to receive exchange as well as to receive feedback on challenges faced by the programme and how to improve partnerships aiming to address the urban development needs of ACP countries and lead concrete investment action towards sustainable urban development.
