# Urban water supply & environmental sanitation: A grim future?

- In 2025: over 50% of the African and Asian population will live in cities
- In 2005: more than 50% of the world's poor will ive in city slums & peri-urban areas
- The majority of them will be without employment
- With rudimentary, yet very expensive, basic urban services, cities face **seemingly** unsolvable environmental problems


- Household-Centred Environmental Sanitation Approach (HCES)




