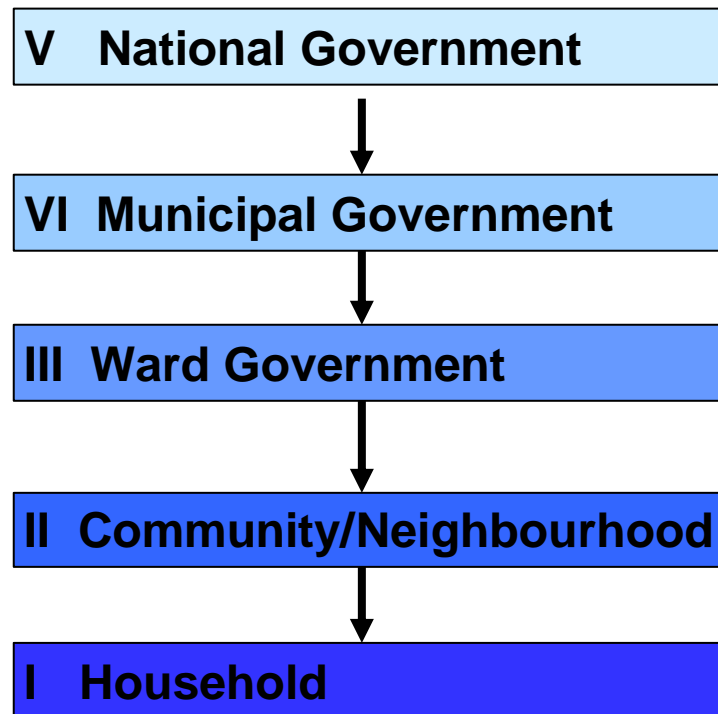
Urban water supply & environmental sanitation: A grim future?

- *In 2025: over 50% of the African and Asian population will live in cities*
- *In 2005: more than 50% of the world's poor will live in city slums & peri-urban areas*
- *The majority of them will be without employment*
- *With rudimentary, yet very expensive, basic urban services, cities face **seemingly** unsolvable environmental problems*

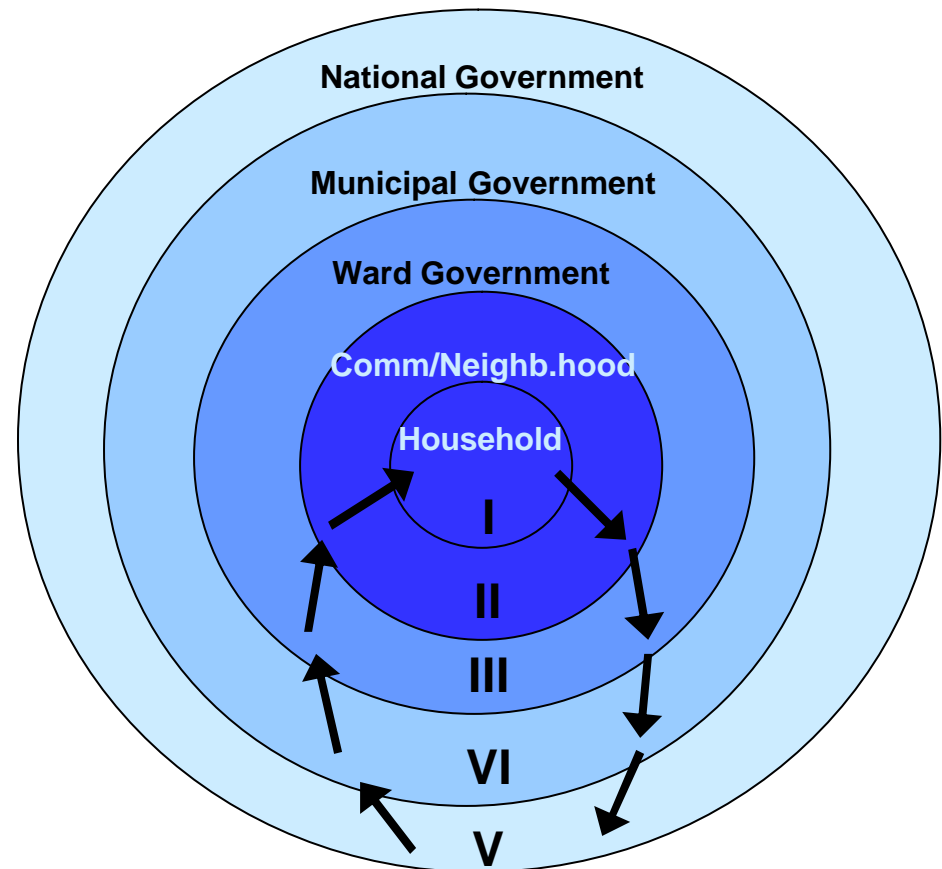

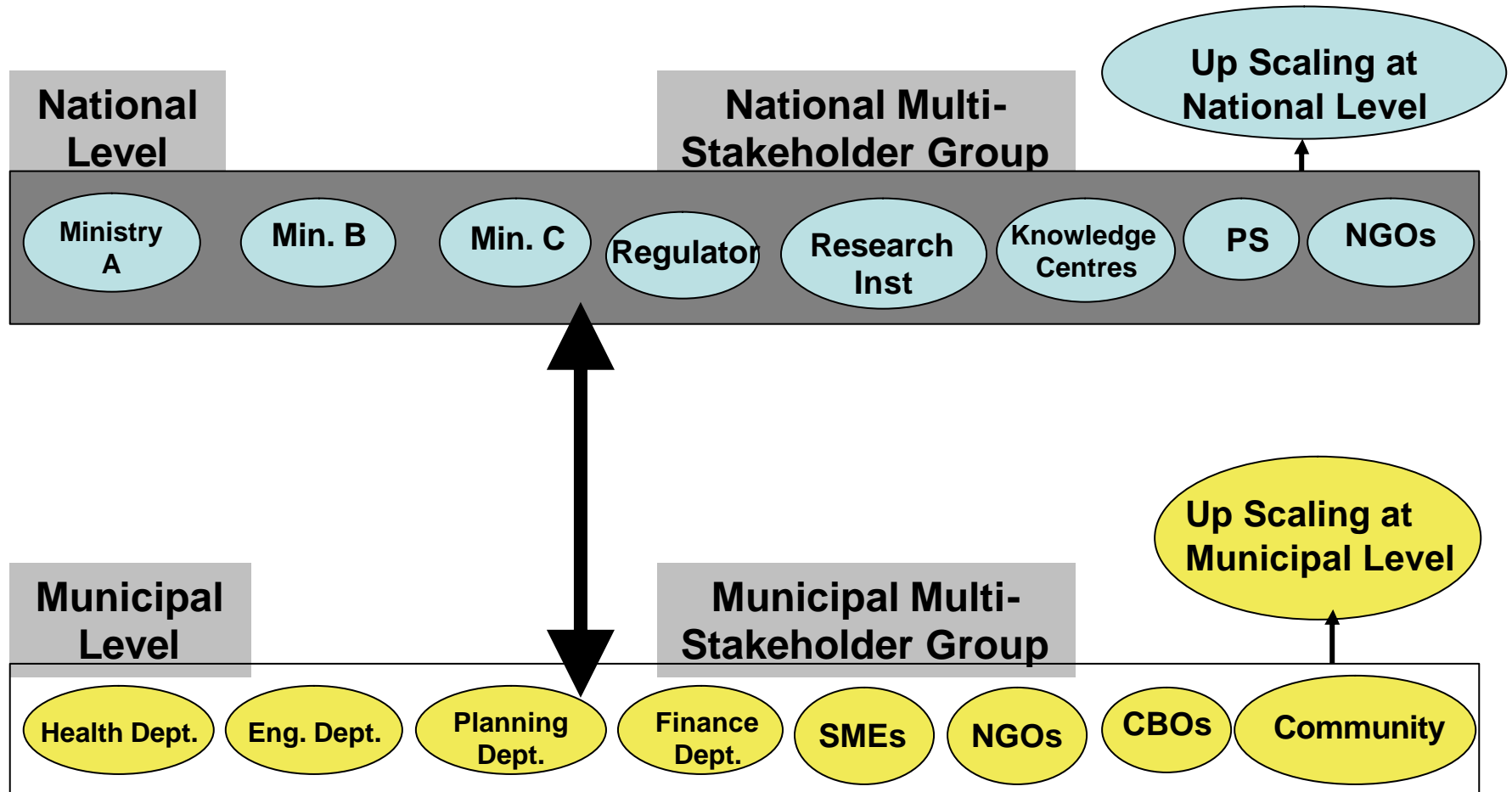
