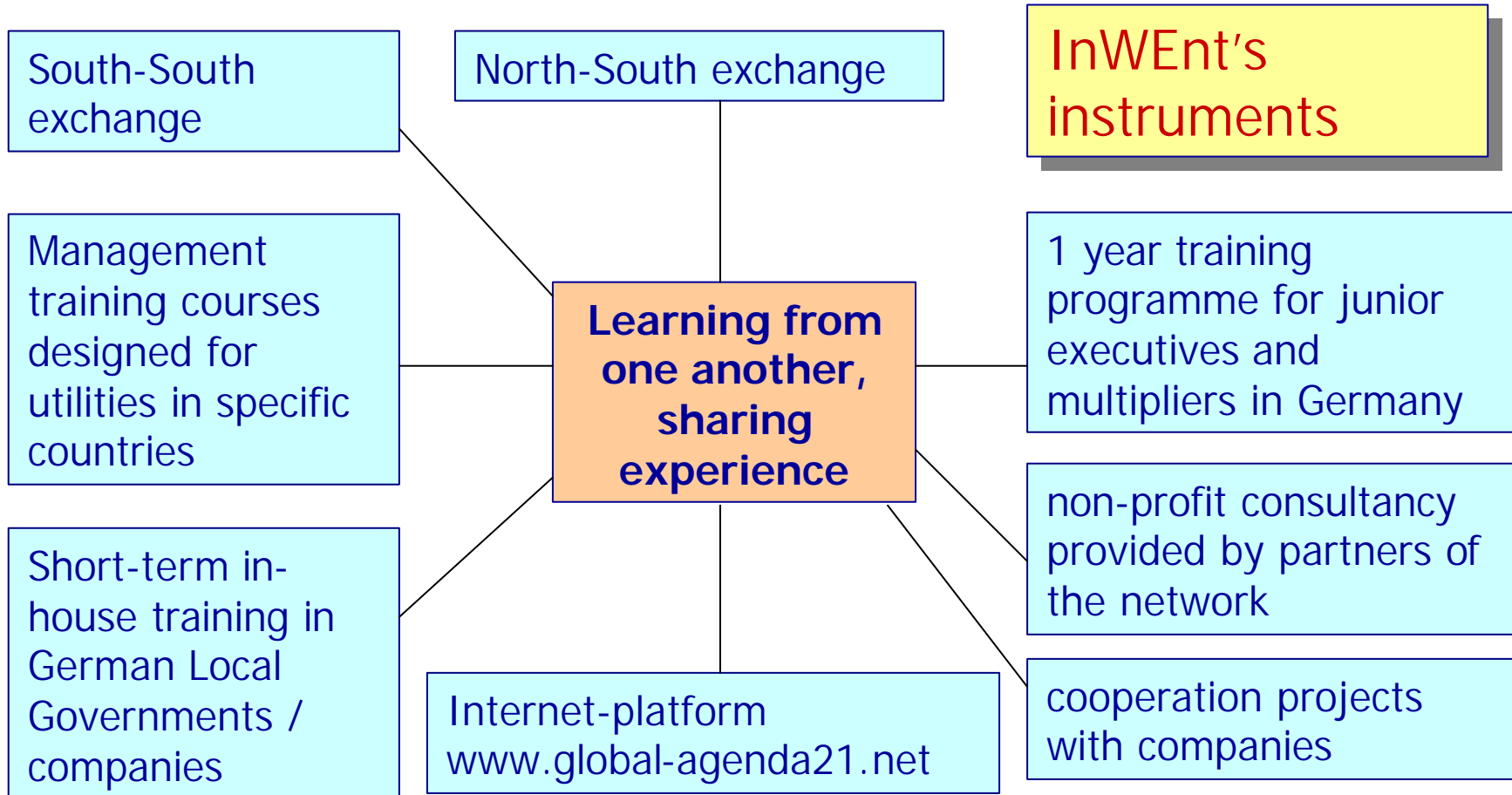
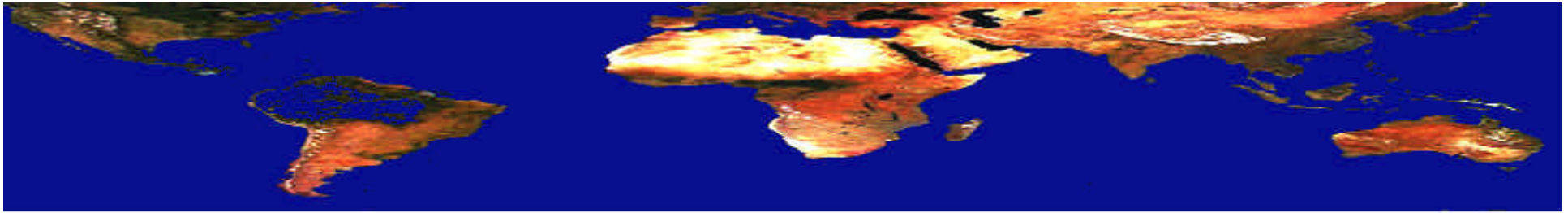
## **Objectives of InWEnt's contribution to SCP/LA21**

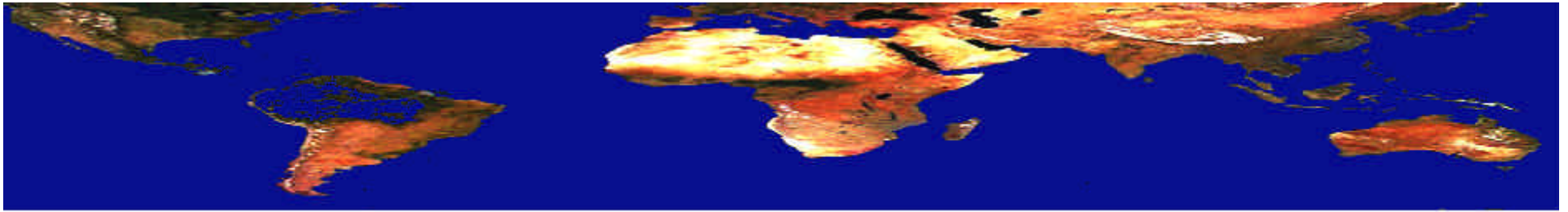
- Enable representatives from participating cities for informed decision-making

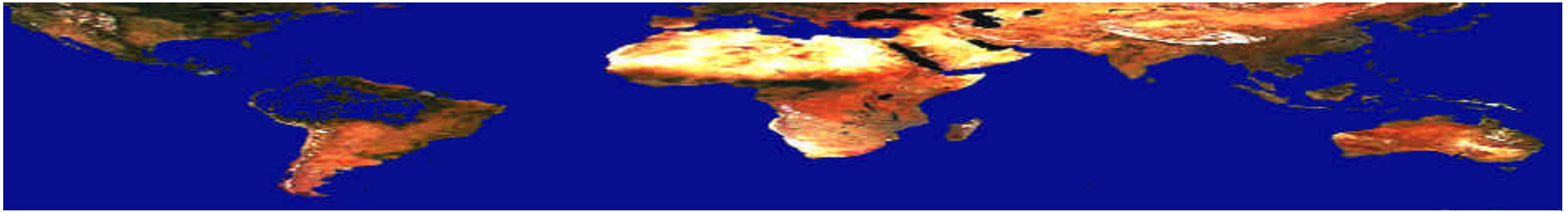


## **Cooperation projects with the private sector**

Capacity building projects which combine development oriented objectives with business interests.

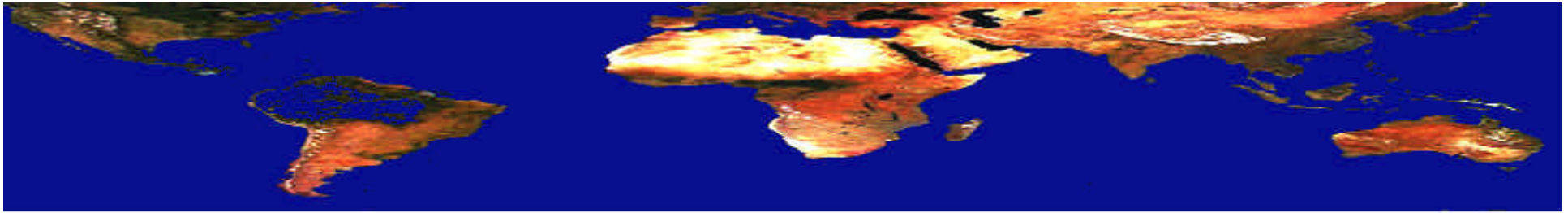
Criteria:

- private company shares at least 50% of the cost



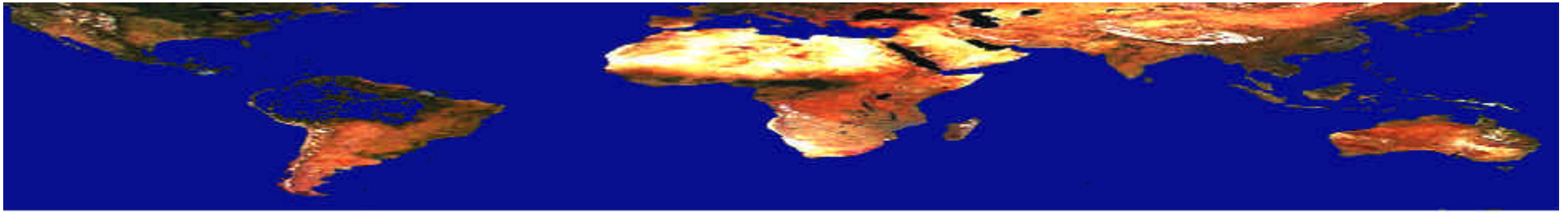
