To increase access of the urban poor to basic services through Private Sector Participation and contribute to the achievement of the MDGs.

#### Learning

To promote development, collection and dissemination of knowledge on local level pro-poor public-private partnership (PPP)



# **PPPUE Programme Focus**

**☆** Focus on Small and Medium-sized cities

Population between 20,000 and 500,000 inhabitants.

Service extension to poor urban neighbourhoods and job creation for the disadvantaged communities.

**№** Focus on Basic Urban Services

Water Supply and Sanitation, Solid Waste Management, Local Energy Services, Central Municipal Services.





## Purpose of the GLN

- Poverty alleviation


#### 2. IPGs are selected through a global competition

- Establishing Adequate Policy, Legal and Institutional Frameworks for local PPP.
- Building Local Capacity for PPP
- Facilitate the implementation of Innovative pro-poor PPP



# Local level activities: 1st generation



- <u>IPGs:</u> Mauritania, Mozambique, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Filipinas, Russia, Ukraine, Argentina Haiti, Peru
- National Programmes: Namibia, Uganda, Nepal
- Other smaller interventions: Mali, Iran, Nepal, Filipinas y Poland



## **Selected PPPUE Results**

- Development of National Policy Guidelines on pro-poor PPP in Nepal and Namibia.
- Local level PPP policy and regulation in Nepal.
- Comprehensive training programme on local PPP (policies, options, regulation, contract monitoring and compliance) delivered through a network of Universities and reputable Training institutions worldwide.
- A Municipal PPP Toolkit developed and tested in PPP projects.
- Establishment of a PPP Community of Practice involving partners from governments, donors, UN Agencies, NGOs and Businesses worldwide.
- A dynamic Learning Network of more than 2000 members generating a new collaborative effort on pro-poor PPP around the world.



# Some Lessons Learned

- ➡ Effective reforms for Municipal PPP should be inclusive and involve all stakeholders (LG, Business & CBO/NGO)
- ⇒ Inclusive regulations that accommodate Communitybased approaches in service delivery.
- Capacity building is needed for all stakeholders (incl PS).
- Knowledge documentation, codification and sharing are key to build and maintain a dynamic community of PPP practitioners and ensure success of new PPP initiatives.
- Need to empower local communities to allow them to participate in policy making processes and monitoring of services provided through PPP.



# IPGs: the next generation

- ⇒ PPP Projects for all urban basic services except waste management: deadline 30 June 2005
- ⇒ PPP projects on waste management: competition will be launched in the coming months.
