TRAINING DETAILS

- July 2008: 6 day training at SPW to learn about the HVWSHE concept and methodology and to observe education practice at the Sathya Sai School. 18 participants.
- August 2008: 6 day training on development of an HVWSHE curriculum, attended by 40 people.
- February 2010: 2 day training workshop on water classroom preparation and management, attended by 40 people.
- February 2011: 2 daytraining on Solid Waste Management and School Environment Sanitation.
- March 2011:4 day HVWSHE Refresher Training Course attended by 62 people from MoEYS and target schools.
- 2 teachers and 1 director were trained in each target school and these 39 people trained all teachers of the target grade in their school.

BENEFICIARIES 4433 target students (2160 females) in 12 schools

IMPACTS

- Increased understanding of the importance of water, sanitation and hygiene.
- Harvesting of rainwater for supplying in schools was increased by 40% in 2011.

- Children tell people in their community about water and how to use it wisely.
- Students observe improved water sanitation and hygiene practices.
- School water and sanitation infrastructure has been improved to enhance the safety and

UN-HABITAT: USD 238,400; Counterpart: USD 337,475

TRAINING DETAILS

- June 2008: 8 people from UN-HABITAT, NCA and District Education Offices participated in a week long training at SPW. Attendees later trained teachers from 22 target school in 2 remote provinces and acted as resource teachers.
- April 2009: 2 day introductory workshop facilitated by SPW. 25 participants.
- June 2009: 6 day training at SPW on integration of HVWSHE, development of lesson plans and observation of SPW water classroom. 28 teachers and 3 NCA staff participated.
- Core teachers trained in pilot schools.
- February 2010: 1 day workshop on the HVWSHE model and methodology, and integration into the curriculum. 71 participants from the education, and water and sanitation sectors.
- September 2010: 2 day training on effective use of water classrooms, use of equipment and integration of HVWSHE lesson plans into subjects. 45 educators attended.

WATER CLASSROOMS

13 water classrooms operating in schools, water utilities, a teacher training

college and as a mobile unit.

BENEFICIARIES

10,200 students in 34 schools.

IMPACTS

Water conservation activities in schools increased two-fold from 2008 – 2010.

- 6.7% of schools began rain water harvesting.
- Significant improvement of conditions of school sanitation facilities, including availability of soap and water.
- Increased understanding of the importance of water, sanitation and hygiene.
