youth are inspired to take positive action.







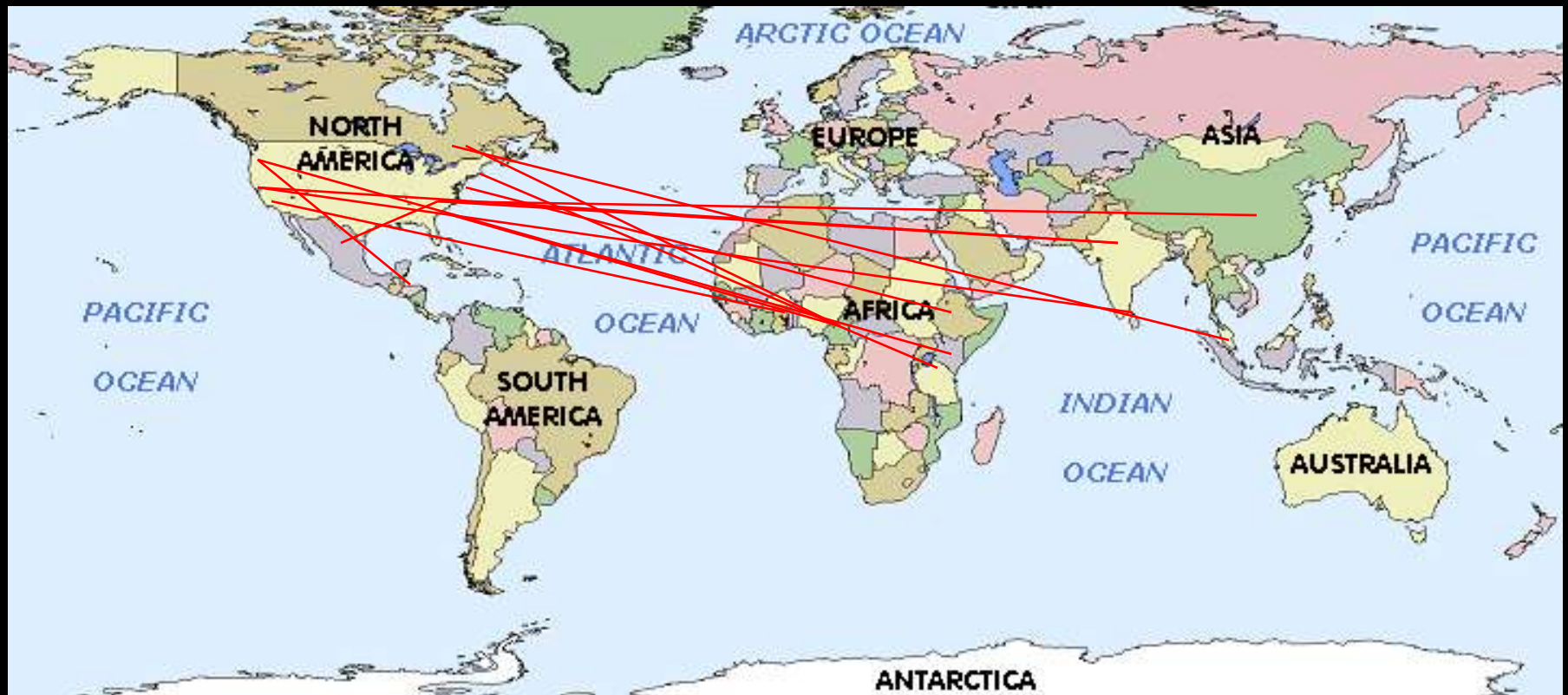

Practical leadership abilities.

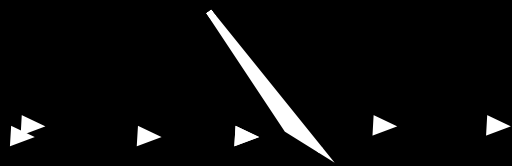
Empowerment through a feeling of importance.
